According to Lenin's plan, *The State and Revolution* was to have consisted of seven chapters, but he did not write the seventh, "The Experience of the Russian Revolutions of 1905 and 1917", and only a detailed plan has remained. In a note to the publisher Lenin wrote that if he "was too slow in completing this, the seventh chapter, or should it turn out to be too bulky, the first six chapters should be published separately as Book One."
